Kilimanjaro stands majestically as the highest point in Africa; a snow capped volcano rooted in the jungles of Tanzania, straddling the Kenyan border.



Trevor's dedication and commitment in accomplishing and surpassing his goal of over \$20,000.00 has been an inspiration to all us joined in the care of cancer patients at the MUHC. Trevor climbs in honour of his wife Randee and the outstanding treatment she received at the Cedars Breast Clinic three years ago.

The Cedars Breast Clinic of the MUHC is a major regional and supra-regional referral centre for patients diagnosed with breast disease. Close to 25,000 women pass through the doors of the Cedars Breast Clinic annually. As a university health centre, it participates in the critical multi-centric clinical research trials that shape the future of breast cancer care. It delivers state-of-the-art treatments to patients and educates future health care professionals. However, its unique attribute is the convergence of all critical elements required for the delivery of a comprehensive diagnostic and treatment plan at the first visit. The Cedars Breast Clinic opened in 2002 following a multi-million dollar fundraising campaign spearheaded by the Cedars Cancer Institute.

The Cedars Cancer Institute is a hospital-based charity that supports comprehensive cancer care and funding to patients and healthcare professionals at the six hospitals of the McGill University Health Centre. Since its inception in 1966, Cedars Cancer Institute has raised more than \$30 million in much-needed funds to purchase state-of-the-art diagnostic oncology equipment, improve facilities for treatment and care of cancer patient and offer cancer patients emotional, practical and humanitarian assistance.
